A 20-year journalist, **Anthony Flint** is now at the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy, a Cambridge think-tank for planning, development policy and the built environment. For the Boston *Globe*, he covered urban life, development, architecture, transportation, urban design and public space. He recently wrote *This Land: The Battle over Sprawl and the Future of America*, a cultural and political account of changing development patterns. *Library Journal* called it “engaging, vivid and provocative.” Written while he was a visiting scholar at Harvard Design School, it chronicles smart growth, New Urbanism, green building, property rights and the powerful forces that propagate sprawl.
